

#### FAB definition in SES2

"FAB (Functional Airspace Block) An airspace block based on operational requirements and established regardless of State boundaries, where the provision of air navigation services and related functions are performance-driven and optimized with a view to introducing, in each functional airspace block, enhanced cooperation among air navigation service providers or, where appropriate, an integrated provider."








#### **NEFAB?**

#### **NEFAB: North European Functional Airspace block:**

- ▲ SES requirement
- NEFAB member states: Estonia, Finland, Latvia and Norway
- Air Navigation Service Providers: Avinor, EANS, Finavia and LGS
- ▲ Formally established 22nd December 2012 by State Level agreements and agreements between ANSPs
- NEFAB Governing body: NEFAB Council (States ministries)

#### **NEFAB Objective:**


to achieve **optimal performance** in the areas relating to **safety, environmental sustainability, capacity, cost-efficiency, flight efficiency and military mission effectiveness**, by the **design of airspace** and the organisation of **air traffic management** in the airspace concerned, **regardless of existing boundaries**
